He was a key figure in establishing our school, and was given an OBE by the Queen of England for his enormous contribution to education. The Crawford Centre was officially inaugurated by Dr Alex Tinson, one of the most prestigious camel vets in the UAE. Dr Tinson has just published his book "The desert vet", a fascinating account of his experience as a vet in the UAE. He presented the library with some signed copies of his book, which we will treasure for years to come.

Islamic

The Islamic New Year, also known as Arabic New Year or رأس السنة: Hijri New Year (Arabic: -Ra's al-Sanah al الهجرية Hijrīyah) is the day that marks the beginning of a new Islamic calendar year, and is the day on which the year count is incremented. The first day of the year is observed on the first day of Muharram, the first month in the Islamic calendar. The first Islamic year begins in 622 AD with the emigration of Prophet Muhammad from Mecca to Medina, known as the <u>Hijra</u>.<sup>1</sup>All religious duties, such as prayer, fasting in the month of Ramadan, and pilgrimage, and the dates of significant events, such as celebration of holy nights and festivals, are calculated according to the lunar calendar. Islamic Classes run different activities to enrich this information about al
