Nature Walk



Prior to going out in the playground on our Nature Walk, FS2B watched a video of a robin making a nest which led to a discussion. The children therefore knew what materials to look for on our Nature Walk. We also talked about having respect for our environment and that the children could only pick materials from the ground.



Children explored the playground and went on a hunt for leaves/twigs/flowers/ soft materials etc. so that they could build a nest. They were excited to go outside and smell/touch the materials that they found. They developed respect for the environment as they all only picked materials from the ground and did not pull anything from shrubs or pick flowers etc.

The children are now very excited to build a nest with all their materials, make birds using various materials in our class and also practice our "n" sound or attempt to phonetically write nest. One student has told me that she is going to bring in pictures of her bird that she has at home and ask her mommy to build a nest for her bird. It was a fantastic learning experience and just one of the many nature walks that we will do this year.



Year 6

As part of our Science topic, we have been studying Healthy living and discussing the different food groups and how exercise is essential to keeping us healthy. We discussed how the heart is responsible for pumping Oxygenated blood to the body and that, during exercise, our hearts must work harder as our bodies need more oxygen. To test this, we investigated what happens to our heart rates when we exercise. First we took our resting pulse rates, then did 1min vigorous exercise and took our pulse rates again. After repeating this three times, we found our average pulse rate after exercise. It was great fun completing the investigations in groups!



In Morality, we have been discussing the four pillars of Morality: Individual and Community; Cultural Studies; Civic Studies and Character and Morality. In groups, we brainstormed the meanings of these and produced work to illustrate what each meant.

"It has been another fantastic week in Year 3. Inspired by the Green Ship (English) and healthy eating (Science), all of Year 3 used what we have learned about food groups and nutrition to make healthy sandwiches this week. Following plans we made during science lessons, we brought in our own healthy ingredients and (taking sensible safety/hygiene precautions) made delicious sandwiches!! We then held a picnic for the whole year group in our school canteen. We will now use new learning content from English (time openers e.g. first, a few minutes later, after that, next etc.) to write a recount of the experience.
