Year 1

The Year One's have been very busy these past few weeks!! In **Science** we have been learning a lot about <u>animals</u> and their <u>habitats</u>. We have even visited the Al Ain Zoo to see these animals in real life!





Animals living in different habitats, like the Ocean, Forest, Arctic and even our own Desesrt! We worked together in groups to draw these animals and enjoyed making our own dioramas to show animals in their habitats.



In Integrated Curriculum we made some interesting silhouette pictures with lovely sunset backgrounds!





In English we learnt to use adjectives in our sentences, to make our writing even more interesting!! We painted and described the butterfly from 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar', using adjectives. Year 6

As part of our Extreme Earth topic, we have been learning all about Tsunamis and their destructive powers. This week, we linked our topic work to our Art and looked at the famous painting of 'The Great Wave' by Hokusai. We discussed the use of cool and warm colours and how the artist used them effectively in his painting. We identified the different layers of the painting, which included the 3 waves, the landscape and the famous Mount Fuji. Then we practised sketching them, recreating his portrait to the best of our abilities. Lastly, we looked up in Google Translate how to write our names in Japanese and we will be adding that to our portraits.

Year 3 definitely has Talent – lots of it!








Year 2

In maths, along with practicing "one more & one less" we are using real scales to determine weights of various things and better understand the meaning of "lighter & heavier".
