#### FS2

#### Year 5

We have had another exciting week of learning. Pupils had a chance to show how much they have learnt during term 2 by taking assessments in Writing, Reading and Maths.

In Writing pupils sat two assessments. A narrative one titled "Through the door..." and a non-chronological report on the UAE or AAESS.

In Maths pupils completed an arithmetic paper and a reasoning paper on all four operations, word problems, place value and fractions.

Pupils were assessed on two reading comprehensions. One was a non-chronological report on Brazil and the other one was a narrative piece titled "Down through the Rabbit Hole."

In FS2 we will be expanding our vocabulary and sentence structures reflecting the digraphs of "ch", "sh", "th" and "ee". In maths we will develop the purpose and use of the terms "more & less", "heavier & lighter" and practicing our number formation, sense and order.
