Year 5

It has been two weeks of fantastic learning in year 5.

Last week, AAESS Sixth Form came to support our students with their English lesson helping them to redraft, edit and improve their writing. They will be supporting our pupils each week with their maths, writing or reading. During their first visit the 6th formers commented on how impressed they were with our students' writing abilities!



Year 5

We have learnt about biographies and autobiographies. We have looked at the features of these texts and we have explored the autobiographies of different famous people such as Roald Dahl. Pupils have written their own autobiographies highlighting the main events in their lives so far.



We have learnt about our local area, Al Ain. We have researched its landmarks and monuments and we have created posters to advertise it to the UAE and the rest of the world. Also, we have created UAE masks in the stlyle of Pablo Picasso.

In science, we have learnt about the human skeleton and its function. Pupils compared the human skeleton to the skeleton of animals. We have carried a scientific investigation on bones and pupils wrote their conclusions. We have also learnt about the muscles of the human body, what muscles are involved in every day activities and we have investigated muscle fatigue with desert sand bags.



Year 1

In Year 1, we have been reading the book Rainbow Fish. We discussed how Rainbow Fish showed kindness by sharing his beautiful, shiny scales. This made us think about how we can also show kindness at school and at home.

The children used a range of materials to make their very own shiny rainbow fish. Year 1 also showed off their brilliant writing skills to their teachers by becoming authors and writing their own rainbow stories about different rainbow creatures.

Year 4

Maths:

We have been working hard on our place value as this acts as the building blocks needed to move forward. Rounding, finding the value, ordering and sequencing, adding and subtracting 10, 100, 1000.

English:

We have continued looking at a story setting. Looking at pictures to describe, and experimenting with adjectives, adverbs and conjunctions.



Integrated Curriculum:

We are discussing the importance of pearl diving in the history of the UAE.

We are creating wanted posters for the first four Golden Ticket finders in the *Charlie and the Chocolate Factory* novel.



Science:

We have been discussing the different food groups and what constitutes a balanced diet. We have had a look at the function of each food group and the importance it has for our bodies.

Year 6

In Art, we are learning about Portraits and looking at how to sketch portraits of ourselves based on the work of famous artists. The artist we are studying is Romero Britto, a famous Brazilian artist, whose portraits combine elements of cubism, pop art and graffiti, distinctive for its vibrant colors and bold patterns. We are creating our own portraits in his style and have investigated patterns and contrasting colours. To create our portraits, we have carefully traced an A4 photograph of our faces, and then traced it onto blank paper, incorporating some of his widely used patterns: circles, lines, flowers and hearts.

Year 3

This week, the Year 3 children have been learning about the importance of exercise and eating the right amounts of different types of food. Learning about a balanced diet has produced some interesting conversations and will lead onto the children designing and preparing healthy sandwiches later in the term. Studying the function of the muscles in the human body saw the children experimenting with the different muscles to see how certain exercises affect them. Lots of fun and learning taking place across the classes.
