Year 2

We are starting to write our own stories based on the Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch and are wondering how different the story would be if it was set in the UAE?



FS2

The children in FS2 have been involved in lots of fun activities, games and crafts to learn new phonemes and numbers. We have been busy with paints and scissors to create alligators, tigers, parrots and insects to support our learning of the phonemes of /s/, /a/, /t/, /p/, /i/ and /n/. We have also been counting from numbers 1 to 4, supported by counting out 3 and 4 toppings to put on our pizzas.

Year 3

Year 3 have been learning all about respect and manners. We talked about what how important being respectful is and what this looks like. We also learned two great respect songs with some members of 3A and 3C displaying their knowledge and talents in Assembly on Thursday. Also in year 3 we have been learning about being healthy and what this means. As a part of this, we will be designing and making sandwiches at school. Before we do that, we thought we would taste a wide variety of breads and see how they taste. That was a lot of fun.







Year 5

Writing

We have learnt about newspapers and their features. We have also learnt about direct and reported speech, facts and opinions and eyewitness recounts. Pupils have now planned and written a newspaper recount based on the disappearance of the House Point Cup.

Maths

We have learnt mental and written methods for addition and subtraction. Some of these have included using a number line to count on when subtracting numbers mentally.



Integrated curriculum

Our UAE Picasso masks are finished and they look incredible. We have learnt about forts and their most prominent features and pupils have designed their own one. In addition, we have created a guide to the emirates focusing on different emirates and their capital cities.



Year 5

Science


In science, we have learnt about materials, their properties and the most effective uses of those materials. We have also conducted a fair test to find out which material would make the best cup.



Year 4

Maths:

Students have now completed their Place Value Unit. We have measured the progress and have seen wonderful improvement in their ability. Our next unit of work is Addition and Subtraction (column method).



Year 4 Continued

English:

Year 4 have been working hard, learning the necessary writing skills to create a descriptive setting for their Wishing Tales. In connection with our now recent topic "Abu Dhabi" we will now turn to non-fiction and create diary entries. This will not only focus on the ability to write in 1st person and recount recent events. We will also be learning about famous and influential people who have shaped and developed Abu Dhabi to the magnificent city that it is today and place themselves in their shoes.

Integrated Curriculum:

We have been learning about the history of oil in Abu Dhabi. Our students were very surprised to learn that Jacques Cousteau came to Abu Dhabi in the 1950's to explore the Gulf for oil.

Science:

We will be having a Science Day in year 4 next week. Our learners will be looking at the designs of different bridges in the UAE. Thereafter, they will complete a design brief and construct their own model (that will have to support a load of 1kg).

Year 6

In Science, year 6 went on an information hunt!

They were comparing the life cycles of amphibians and insects.

The information they needed was stuck on the doors and walls outside the classrooms. However, it was a tricky task as there were four different creatures and the facts were mixed up!

It was lovely to see the children working collaboratively to help each other find the relevant information and begin to discuss the similarities and differences between each lifecycle.

Reflecting on the lesson the children commented that they enjoyed getting out of the classroom and moving around to locate the facts they needed.
