

Year 9/10 Boys: The boys played with tremendous passion but sadly just fell short in their game.



Look out next month as AAESS takes on teams like Brighton College and ALDAR Academy in even more basketball tournaments!



If you are not feeling sleepy, get out of bed and do something to tire you out e.g. meditate or read a book.






Avoid napping during the day if its possible.
