#### **FS1 Yellow**

We are doing our phonics at home and have been decorating our letter "a". We are also learning about healthy food and tasting watermelon.

#### FS1 Blue

#### FS 1 Red

#### FS2

Welcome back for the second half of the first term – what a busy term it is!

The FS2 classes have been learning about three new phonemes: /c/, /k/, and /ck/. We have also been making crowns, camels, kandoras, kites and clocks to support the new learning.

In PSRN we have learned to read, write, and count up to 8 - which is a super tricky number to write! We have been counting camels, children, and the numbers on our clocks.

The FS2 children joined the whole school in celebrating the UAE's flag day on 01<sup>st</sup>
November by waving the flags they had made in class as the National Anthem played.

## Year 1

The Year 1 classes have been very busy this week as they began learning about the building of the new classrooms within school.

On Sunday, the children prepared themselves with clipboards and paper for a first hand learning experience, in the boardroom of the admin building. The children observed the building work and they made sketches and labels of what they noticed. We discussed the role of the workers and how teamwork is needed to make a project successful. Then we observed the materials being used to make firm foundations and learnt about how to create a safe learning environment for the children.

The children also focused on the machines and tools needed to support the building project. Back in the classroom, the children learnt how to label the parts of a JCB digger. They then began to write captions, explaining what they had learnt in more detail.



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#### Year 2

We were excited to start a new topic in Year 2 this week. We are learning about 'What a Wonderful World' surrounds

We are discussing the different ways we see the world around us by using maps, atlases and globes. We are looking through atlases to become more familiar with our world around us. In our atlases, we found different continents, the countries that we come from as well as the country that we live in, the UAE!

There is so much to see and learn about! We are also making our very own treasure maps!





#### Year 3

In Year 3 this week, during Integrated Curriculum, we learnt about the River Nile and the different types of food the Egyptians ate. A model of the River Nile was made by the Year 3's and is proudly displayed in the central area downstairs.

For Science, the students had a very practical, handson lesson by looking at various rocks and classifying them accordingly.

In English, the students are feverishly busy with writing their paragraphs for their 'All About Me' posters.







#### Year 4

In Maths, we are completing our unit on column method addition and subtraction. We will be focusing on word problems, where the learners will be required to demonstrate an understanding of the vocabulary used in Maths problems.

In English, our learners have completed their final diary writing piece, where the learners were required to write a diary entry from Sheikh Zayed's perspective. We will now be moving on to persuasive writing.

Integrated Curriculum: We have looked at how Abu Dhabi has changed since Thesiger visited us 70 years ago.

In Science, we are classifying organisms into living or non-living, and into which animal class they belong. Our main focus is the organisms of the UAE.





#### Year 5

#### Writing

We have started to learn about Roman versions of Greek myths. We have focused on synonyms, understanding why people had the need to tell myths in Ancient times, character description (adjectives and noun phrases) and sequencing the myth.

#### Maths

We have learnt about the most effective strategies to work out different addition and subtraction calculations. We have also worked on balancing equations with missing numbers, algebraic equations, using inverse operations to check answers and problems involving all of the above.

#### Integrated curriculum

Pupils have assessed all the forts that were made and then justified their choices using very accurate vocabulary. We have also learnt about the past of Rome through artefacts and have created a timeline of Roman and UAE main events.

#### Science

In science, we have grouped materials based on the property of magnetism. We tested different objects to see if they were magnetic or non-magnetic and we drew a conclusion based on our results.





#### Year 6

Over the past 2 weeks we have drawn our study of the UAE's land use and economic activity to a close with closer research on particular industries within the UAE. Specifically, students have been researching the importance of the Oil industry to the UAE economy, and also researching the details of the date industry, fishing and the production of poultry and eggs. Students have found out how much has been produced per year in each industry and the process of how each product is completed, ready for sale. They have also learnt about the specific problems each industry faces.

Having left this study behind, the students are really excited to be "travelling to Europe". After expanding their knowledge on capital cities and countries of Europe, students will be looking at 6 European countries in detail, with a focus on tourist attractions, climate and weather, family life, languages and physical geography to name a few. The aim is to compare similarities and differences of these countries with what we already know about these areas in the UAE.




#### READING 4 PLEASURE
