



Dubai Metro 10th Anniversary

At 09:09pm on September 9, 2009 Dubai Roads and Transport Authority launched the Dubai Metro, and this time, over 1.5 billion people have used the transport service. Within the first 10 years the Metro has completed 2.348 million journeys and covered around 81.133 million km. The Metro Red Line is being extended from Nakheel Harbour and Tower Station to the site of Expo 2020 and it's known as Route 2020. His Highness Sheikh Mohammed Bin Rashid Al Maktoum shared this information via twitter on September 8th, "Dubai Metro was once a dream. I was 10 years old when I visited London in 1959 with my father who insisted to see a train's cockpit. 50 years later, Dubai Metro came true in 2009. Nothing is impossible if you can dream it."
