It is impossible to get the home-school communication balance right to suit everyone. However, the use of email is our main form of communication with parents. All letters, newsletters, forms etc are sent by email as we try to reduce paper usage as much as possible. It is therefore crucial that the registration department and class teachers have the correct email address for you.



All class teachers have a school email address for contact. The learning pathways are published each week on the school website and provide links to their email addresses.

When contacting staff please remember they have family time outside of school too. Staff are expected to read emails daily (Sunday - Thursday) and respond within 24 hours. They may choose to read or respond outside of school hours but please do not expect it. Please also bear in mind that they will be teaching or in meetings during the school day (7.30am - 3.00pm) so will not be able to respond straight away.

Five of my favourite things:








'Grand Designs' is the first topic for Year 4 and the children have started it by considering why Abu Dhabi has so many long and large bridges.

I did a skydive raising lots of money for charity when I was 17.




Neus from Tear 6


News from Teast 6
