Preschool learning:

Week beginning: Monday 21st October 2024

This week in phonics we will first take a look at the story Goldilocks and the Three Bears and discuss the different kinds of sounds we could imagine there might be in the story. Using a variety of instruments, we will create those sounds as a group and also have the opportunity to have a solo debut while following the story.

This week in maths we will revisit our most recent learning of using finger numbers to 5 and counting different objects using one to one correspondence. This will ensure that we have a good understanding before moving forward onto our next exciting math learning adventure.

This week in literacy we will be talking about everything that we did in the midterm holiday with our friends, family and mini monsters. We will look at the different photos our friends have taken on their adventures to see if we recognise any familiar places. We will display our photos in our class for everyone to see and to be used for further discussions. We will attempt to tell our own story to our teachers.

This week in understanding the world we will continue to explore different occupations through role play, dress up and by looking at pictures in books to extend and develop our ideas. Using materials, we will think about the different colours and styles we need to create to look similar to some of our favourite occupations using our innovation skills to add to our costumes.

This week in expressive art and design we will explore and develop our pretend play from our adventures during the midterm break. We will learn to incorporate a variety of objects into our play such as building blocks or containers to help us playout or copy a story we have read, or something we have experienced on our travels or time with our families.


Preschool PE Days:
