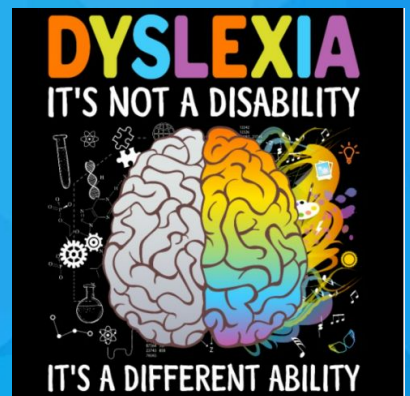
DYSLEXIA

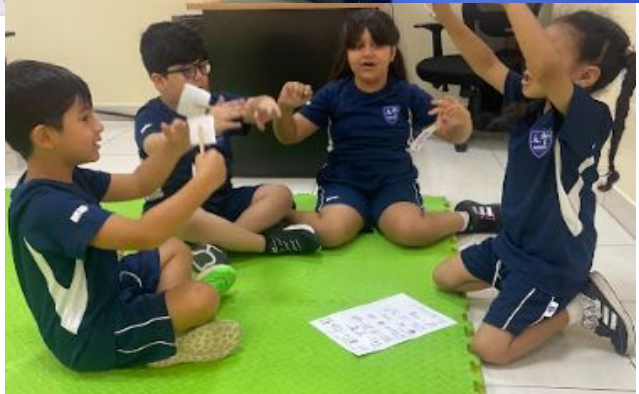
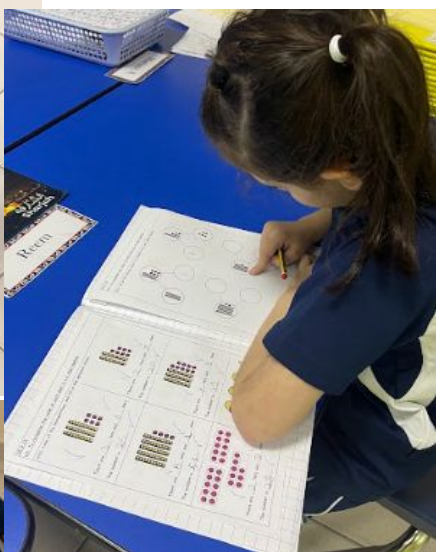
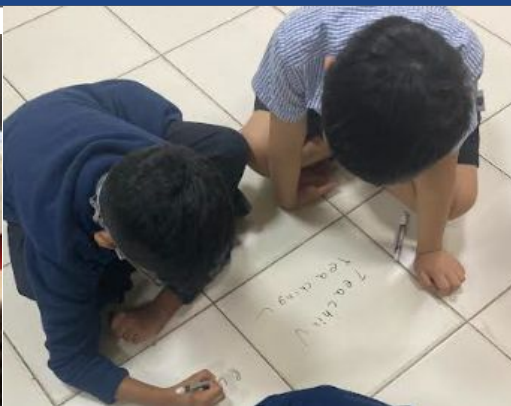

Year 1 have used a range of practical resources to develop their understanding of comparing numbers and continue to excitedly develop their skills during their continuous provision.



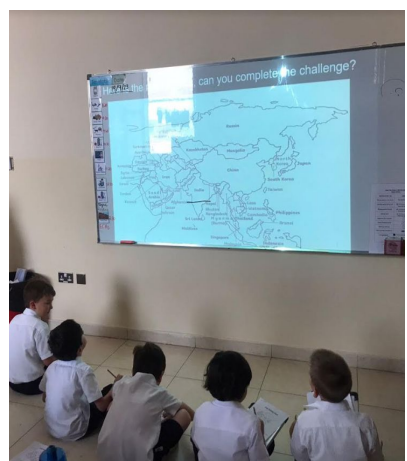
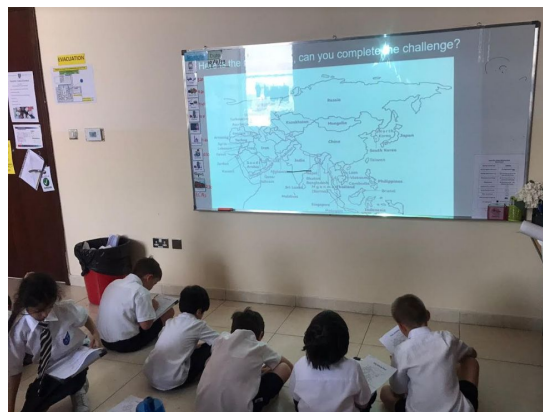
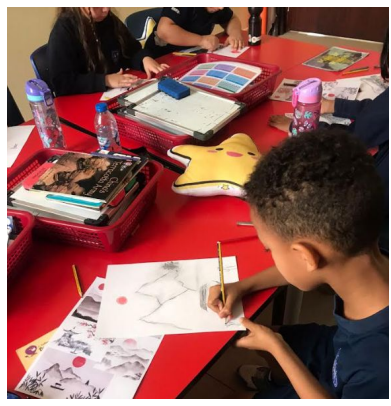

Year 2 have had a great week conducting science investigations, partitioning two digit numbers and continuing to develop their understanding of the Lighthouse Keeper's Cottage.



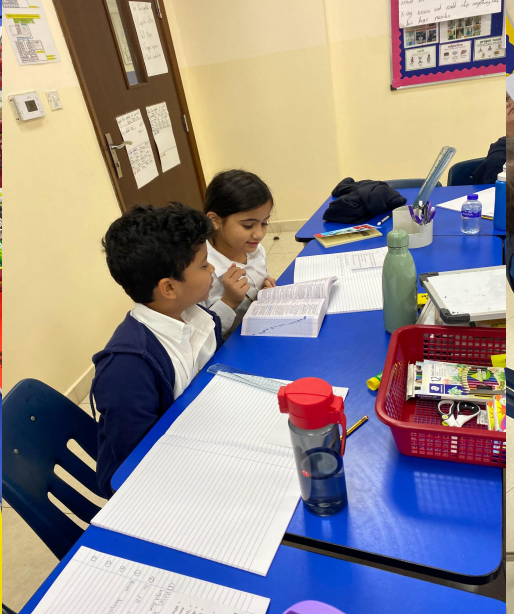

Year 3 enjoyed their visit to the Far East as their 'GreenShip' has continued to explore the globe.



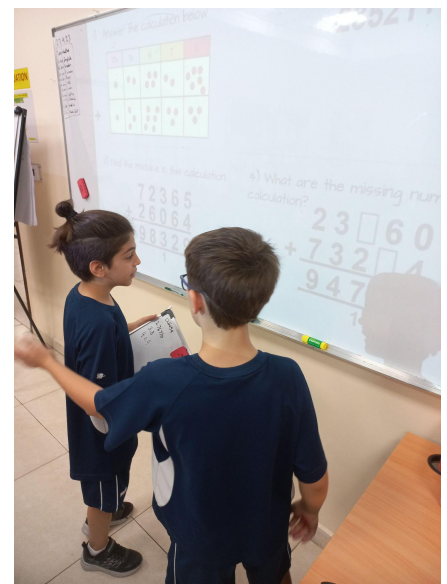
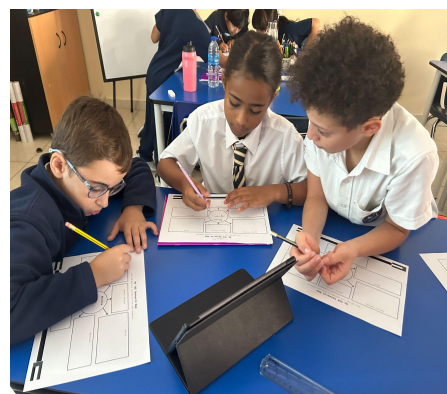
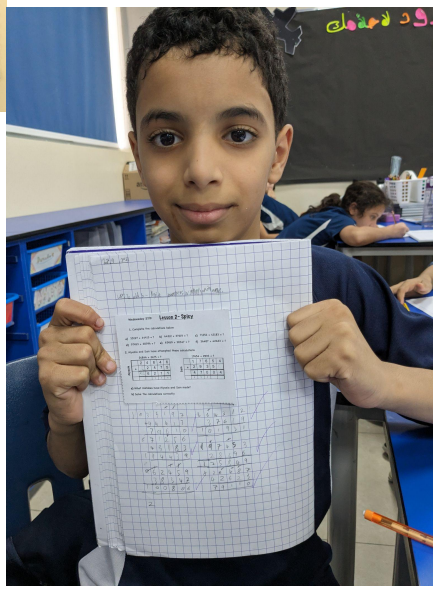
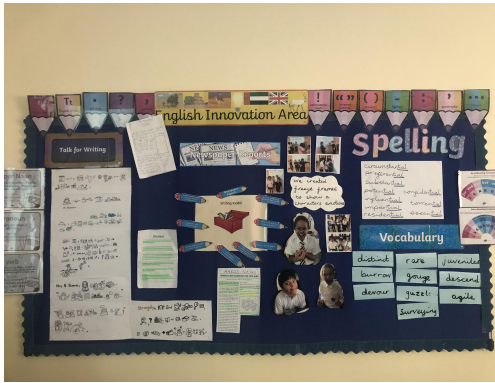

Year 4 have worked collaboratively in all areas of the curriculum this week to support each other in their learning tasks.



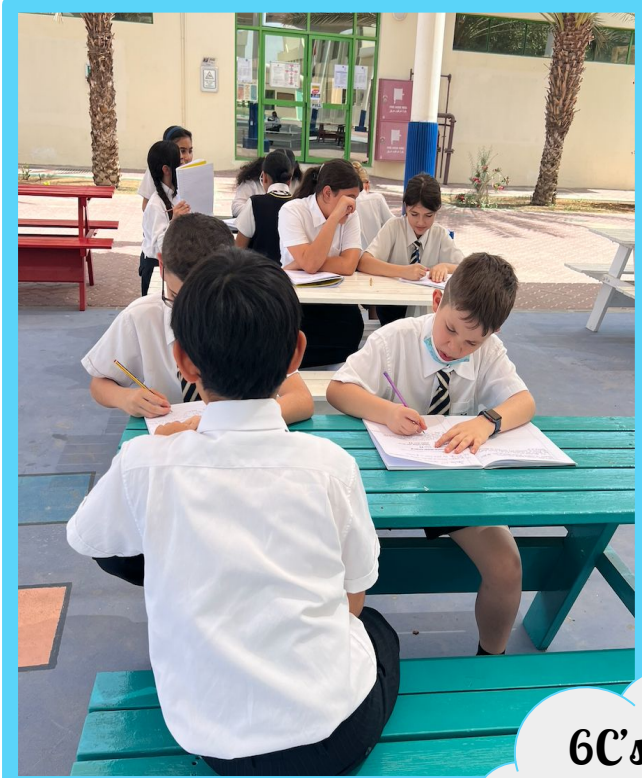
