






Newsfrom Learning Support

Dysgraphia



Dysgraphia is a processing disorder which can affect organization and concentration, as well as fine motor skills. These areas of difficulties can change throughout a lifetime. Dysgraphia can overlap with other learning and neurodevelopmental disorders.

Dyscalculia

Dyscalculia is a specific and persistent difficulty in understanding numbers which can impair an individual's ability to learn number-related concepts, perform accurate maths calculations, reason and problem solve, and perform other basic maths skills. Dyscalculia is sometimes called "number dyslexia" or "maths dyslexia."

How to help

Copying letters from models/examples

Letter formation and handwriting practice using multi-sensory exercises

Playing with clay, play dough to strengthen finger/hand muscles

Developing fine motor control with mazes, cutting exercises, using pegs etc.

Touch-typing and use of computers

Ways to help kids with dyscalculia



Multisensory structured math instruction engages kids through sight, hearing, movement and touch.



Accommodations, like taking untimed tests or using blocks or other objects to help solve a math problem, can help kids show what they know.



Assistive technology tools, like calculators and digital graph paper, can help level the playing field for kids who struggle with math.

Year 4 have spent the week completing different challenges, investigations or enquiries and solving problems.






Another great week in year 5 as the childre shared their fort making projects and collaborated on different learning opportunities.
