End of Year Expectations

This leaflet provides information for parents and carers on the end of year expectations for children in our school.



Reading

Read age appropriate texts with fluency and expression.

Refer to the text to support opinions and predictions. Give a view about an author's choice of vocabulary. Distinguish between fact and opinion.

Appreciate how a set of sentences has been arranged to create maximum effect.

Explain how a writer has used sentences to create particular effects.

Retrieve, record and present information from non-fiction

Recommend books previously read, giving reasons for their choice.

Show their understanding by predicting what might happen from details stated or implied.



Writing

Punctuate sentences accurately with a range of punctuation matched to requirements of text.

Use expanded noun phrases to convey complicated information concisely (e.g. The fact that it was raining meant the end of sports day).

Use a sentence structure and layout matched to requirements of text type.

Use a colon to introduce a list.

Use correct punctuation of bullet points.

Use a wide range of devices to build cohesion within and across paragraphs.

Use paragraphs to signal change in time, scene, action, mood or person.

Assess the effectiveness of their own and others' writing.

Write legibly, fluently and with increasing speed.



Maths

Use negative numbers in context and calculate intervals across zero.

Compare and order numbers up to 10,000,000.

Identify common factors, common multiples and prime numbers.

Recall and use multiplication and division facts for all tables.

Use knowledge of order of operations to carry out calculations involving four operations.

Multiply 4-digit by 2-digit Divide 4-digit by 2-digit

Recognise the relationship between fractions, decimals and percentages, finding equivalences.

Add and subtract fractions with different denominators and mixed numbers.

Multiply simple pairs of proper fractions, writing the answer in the simplest form. Divide proper fractions by whole numbers.

Calculate the percentage of a whole number.

Solve simple algebraic problems and use mathematical reasoning to find missing angles

These objectives will be the focus of direct teaching throughout the year. Any extra support you can provide in helping your children to achieve these is greatly valued.
