Year 3 learning:

Week beginning: Monday 19th May

Maths	Our new topic is Geometry. The children will learn to identify right angles and recognise that two right angles make a half term. They will identify angles less than and greater than a right angle and will learn to draw and measure accurately in cm and mm.
English	The children will be learning the story and actions to our new text 'The Egyptian Cinderella' by Shirley Climo and identifying the plot, beginning, middle and end. They will experience new vocabulary from the text, and will be revisiting nouns and pronouns. The children will be focusing on the setting of Egypt and learning how to use adjectives to write a setting description. Towards the end of the week, the children will be creating a new character that could fit into our story, and writing a character description to describe them.
Science	In science we are revisiting magnets. Firstly learning the theory on poles and practically exploring which poles attract and repel. The children will explore non contact and contact forces practically, as well as learning the theory behind this.
Integrated Curriculum	Our new topic is called Phenomenal pyramids. The children will be learning about Egypt and locating Egypt, the UAE and UK on a world map. Our first week will focus on the capital cities and landmarks in Egypt, and we will begin to introduce historical artefacts. In art, the children will be making a 3D pyramid in the style of Romero Britto.

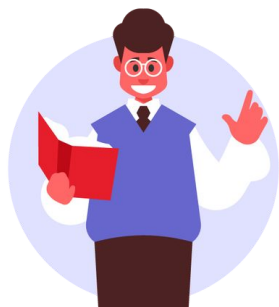

Reading for Pleasure

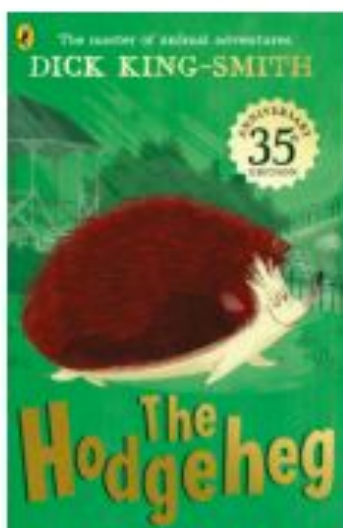
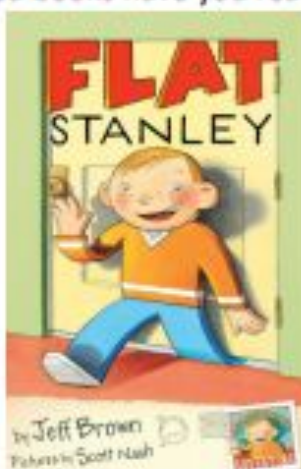
