Dear Parents,

Eid Mubarak! We would like to wish you and your family a very happy and peaceful Eid Al Adha, we hope you have enjoyed a relaxing Eid holiday with your family and friends. Please be reminded that school will resume as normal on Monday 9th June.





Please be reminded that our primary specialist parent and teacher meetings are scheduled for this week on **Tuesday 10th and Wednesday 11th June.**These meetings will give you an opportunity to discuss your child's attainment and progress this term.

We have recently had a surge of requests to collect students from school early. To enable a student to be picked up early, we require a valid reason to upload to ADEK's eSIS system to have the request approved. The guidance provided by ADEK is that early leave should only be granted for a medical appointment (but parents should aim to make such appointments during the weekend or out of school hours), a family crisis such as hospitalisation or a family bereavement or for an official community task.

Year 1 learning:

Week beginning: Monday 9th June

In maths we will revisit our place value topic and we will compare numbers within the same 10 such as which number is less, 38 or 34?. We will use our knowledge of partitioning numbers to explain our reasons for our answers. We will end the week learning about position and direction and will describe turns using half and quarter. We will also use language such as behind, in front to describe position.

During our English lessons, we will complete a recount of our Eid holiday. We will also continue our text 'The journey'. We will discuss the events so far in the story and what we already know then we will make predictions about the next part of the story and explain our thinking linking this to previous events. When w are writing we will ensure that our sentences include capital letters, finger spaces and the correct punctuation.

In our Phonic lessons we will revisit our learning on split digraphs 'a_e'(as in make), 'e-e' (as in even), 'i-e' (as in bike), 'o-e' (as in home), 'u_e' (as in cube) and 'u_e' (as in June). We will use our knowledge to read and spell words containing these sounds as well as forming them correctly. We will practise reading real words and pseudo alien words.

Reading for Pleasure




Reading for pleasure can help to improve student achievement in school. Research has shown that students who read at home do 'significantly better' across the curriculum than students who don't read.


To support our students with their reading choices, we would like to recommend some great books and authors each half term.


Reading regularly in Arabic doesn't just help you get better at the language; it helps you shine in all your subjects too!

Each term, we'll share a list of exciting Arabic books and awesome authors for you to explore.


