Year 3 Learning Pathway Weeks beginning: 9.6.25

Dear Parents,

Everyone at AAESS would like to wish you and your family a lovely Eid Al Adha holiday and remind you that school will resume as normal on Monday 9th June.





We have recently had a surge in requests to collect students from school early. To enable a student to be picked up early, we require a valid reason to upload to ADEK's eSIS system for the request to be approved. The guidance provided by ADEK is that early leave should only be granted for a medical appointment (but parents should aim to make such appointments during the weekend), a family crisis such as hospitalisation, a family bereavement or for an official community task.

If your child/children are unwell they should be kept at home. If your child has had a stomach upset or sickness it is important that you allow a period of at least 48 hours after the sickness or diarrhoea has finished before sending them back to school. Such action will help to prevent the infection spreading unnecessarily to others in the school. In all cases of your child being unwell and unable to come to school, email the class teacher and the attendance officer at csmith@aaess.sch.ae every day your child is absent ensuring their absence is accounted for.

We are always happy to support in any way we can, so if you have any questions or concerns please send your child's class teacher an email (see addresses below).

When contacting staff please remember they are expected to read emails daily (Monday - Friday) and respond within 24 hours. They may choose to read or respond outside of school hours but please do not expect it. Please also bear in mind that they will be teaching or in meetings during the school day (7.30am - 3.00pm) so will not be able to respond straight away.

Year 3 learning:

Week beginning: Monday 9th June

Maths	This week we will be revisiting place value and practising writing numbers to 1000 in numbers and words. The children will be finding 10 and 100 more and less than a given number as well as comparing and ordering numbers up to 1000. We will be exploring number lines and the children will be reading and interpreting numbers on different number lines.	
English	We will be continuing to innovate our class text 'Egyptian Cinderella' planning and writing up paragraphs 4,5 and 6, using our narrative success criteria (punctuation, adjectives, nouns, verbs, time adverbials, and conjunctions)	
Science	This week we will complete a small hot assessment on the last few weeks learning on magnets (the poles and which attract or repel, which metals are magnetic and non magnetic, and non contact and contact forces). The children will then design and create a magnetic game.	
Integrated Curriculum	The children will be exploring Egyptian fashion and will continue to make their egyptian collar necklaces. Your child is welcome to bring in art materials from home to decorate their necklace with (sequins, gems, stickers etc). We will also be exploring the mummification process.


Reading for pleasure can help to improve student achievement in school. Research has shown that students who read at home do 'significantly better' across the curriculum than students who don't read.


