Year 1 learning:

Week beginning: Monday 16th June

In maths we will continue our learning about position and direction. We will begin the week by recapping our work describing turns using half and quarter as well as describing position such as forwards, backwards above and below. We will end the week by revisiting our work on telling the time to the hour and half hour.

During our English lessons, we will learn how to use various punctuation such as question mark and exclamation mark. We will learn how to write this punctuation correctly and identify when to use each type in our work. We will end the week by using question marks and exclamation marks in our writing.

In our Phonic lessons we will revisit our learning for the digraphs 'ew' (as in new), Green Froggy 'ie' (as in field) and Yellow I 'ie' (as in tie). We will use our knowledge to read and spell words containing these sounds as well as forming them correctly. We will practise reading real words and pseudo alien words.

For science, we will work scientifically by completing an *ice cream making* experiment understanding what happens during the experiment. We will continue to ask questions and explore different ways they can be answered.

Reading for Pleasure




Reading for pleasure can help to improve student achievement in school. Research has shown that students who read at home do 'significantly better' across the curriculum than students who don't read.


To support our students with their reading choices, we would like to recommend some great books and authors each half term.




Reading regularly in Arabic doesn't just help you get better at the language; it helps you shine in all your subjects too!

Each term, we'll share a list of exciting Arabic books and awesome authors for you to explore.


