Year 2 learning:

Week beginning: Monday 30th June

Maths	In maths, we will conclude the 'Mass, Capacity and Temperature' unit of work. To begin the week, the children will compare volume and capacity, ensuring that they understand the difference between the meaning of the two words and can apply their knowledge within a real-life context. Next, the children will be taking a practical approach to estimating and measuring liquid in millilitres and litres in the form of a water challenge. Please check your emails from your child's class teacher for further information about this lesson. Following this, the children will learn about temperature. Within this lesson, they will be introduced to thermometers and the unit 'degrees Celsius', written °c. Finally, the children will consolidate their learning from across the year through the use of different maths games.			
English	In English, we will conclude our 'Instructions' unit as the children will finish writing their own instruction text about how to make a smoothie of their choosing. Next, the children will work in groups of three to edit and improve their work using the success criteria to support their ideas. Following this, they will publish their instructions using their neatest handwriting. To finish the week, the children will express their views about different performance poetry and then they will work together to perform one of the poems.			
Science and Integrated Curriculum	To conclude our 'Healthy Me' topic, we will be visiting the STEM kitchen so that the children can create their own fruit salad. To support with this activity, we would like the children to bring in 3 or 4 fruits of their choice as well as a small container for them to put their fruit salad in. Please check your emails from your child's class teacher about which day your child will need to bring in their fruit and container.


Contacting Year 2 Teachers:

Our Yr 2 Recommended English Books





To support our students with their reading choices, we would like to recommend some great books and authors each half term.





So... are you ready to discover a new favourite Arabic book? How many have you read so far?


