Behaviour Expectations

It is our firm belief at AAESS that children work better and learn more effectively in a happy, safe atmosphere based upon courtesy and respect for one another.

We understand that children need to have choices, but they also need boundaries. Therefore, our positive behaviour policy aims to; create a culture that promotes excellent behaviour, outlines our expectations, defines what we consider to be unacceptable behaviour and details our restorative behaviour process.

All members of staff are responsible for maintaining a calm, caring and disciplined atmosphere that creates a purposeful learning environment. In each year group we celebrate positive behaviour openly to reinforce it.

However, if the rules are not followed, we work restoratively, to guide children to better outcomes and ensure they take responsibility for their behaviour. When addressing behaviour that needs improvement, we follow a supportive three-step process:



1. **Remind** – Speak to the student privately to provide constructive feedback without causing any embarrassment.



2. **Reflect** – Help the student reflect on their actions, regulate their emotions, and take responsibility.



3. **Repair** – Support the student in repairing any harm caused to relationships or property. Provide strategies to support the student in improving their behaviour choices.

Our School Rules

At our school, we believe in creating a safe, welcoming, and focused learning environment for everyone. We follow these three important rules:

1. We Are Kind



- We use kind words and actions toward others.
- We help each other and include everyone.
- We treat others the way we want to be treated.

2. We Show Respect



- We listen when others are speaking.
- We take care of school property and personal belongings.
- We follow directions from teachers and staff.

3. We Are Ready to Learn



- We come to school prepared and on time.
- We stay focused and try our best.
- We ask for help when we need it and keep a positive attitude.

Student Protection

There are very effective policies and procedures in place to ensure students who attend AAESS feel valued and protected. All members of staff have a duty of care towards their students and are responsible for their wellbeing, safety, and protection whilst they are under our supervision.

Our belief is that all AAESS students have a right to the protection regardless of age, gender, ability, race or social background. All staff are trained to deal sensitively and effectively with any student concerns or needs, and know where to seek appropriate support.



To further protect our students and in the interest of safety and security, all adults on site are required to wear an AAESS lanyard. Parents can apply for a permanent access pass to be used during their visits, while all other visitors to the site will be issued a temporary lanyard by security.

Our Designated Safeguarding Lead and the safeguarding team ensure thorough measures are in place to safeguard and protect all AAESS students, including child protection. However, if you have any concerns in this regard, please don't hesitate to contact us.



Primary Curriculum

The Primary School is a place where children will learn and develop key skills to be educated and become successful life-long learners.

AAESS is an exciting learning environment, providing a high quality education based on the National Curriculum of England for students aged between 3-11 years.



The standards for learning and development are divided into 3 age groups:

- Early Years Foundation Stage (Preschool and Foundation Stage 2)
- Key Stage 1 (Years 1 and 2)
- Key Stage 2 (Years 3 - 6)



Our primary school curriculum aims to promote pupils' communication skills, creativity and independent critical thinking. Each year group delivers the curriculum through a thematic and engaging cross-curricular approach, with each theme taking a subject to drive the learning forward. An enquiry-based approach provides our pupils with the opportunity to work collaboratively, innovatively and develop higher order thinking skills.

Early Years Foundation Stage (Preschool & FS2)

The curriculum for the Foundation Stage is divided into seven areas of learning and the children work towards achieving the Early Learning Goals.

- **Personal, Social & Emotional Development**
- **Communication & Language**
- **Physical Development**
- Literacy
- Mathematics
- Expressive Arts and Design
- Understanding the World



Prime Areas

Personal, Social & Emotional Development



The Foundation Stage children will develop in confidence and learn to make effective relationships. They are encouraged to show care and respect for the needs and feelings of others, while also developing their understanding of the importance of sharing and taking turns. Teachers strive to ensure the children feel valued and secure, as well as develop a sense of achievement through learning.

Communication & Language

Throughout the Foundation Stage, the children will have opportunities to: experience a rich **language** environment, develop their confidence and skills in expressing themselves, **speak** and listen in a range of situations. They will listen to stories daily, where they will be encouraged to respond to what they hear with relevant comments, questions or actions.



Physical Development

The children will learn to move confidently and imaginatively with increasing control and coordination. Using the indoor and outdoor areas, with a range of large and small equipment they will develop their balance and awareness of space. They will also begin to handle appropriate tools, objects and malleable materials with safety and increasing control.



Specific Areas

Literacy

During FS, children will learn to read and understand simple sentences. They will develop their phonic knowledge to decode regular words and read them aloud accurately.



Mathematics

Number rhymes, songs and counting games will form an important part of daily activities. The children will compare, sort, match, order, sequence and count using everyday objects. They will develop their skills to recognise and use numbers and become familiar with numbers in their everyday lives. They will also learn to use mathematical language to describe shape, position, size and quantity.

Understanding of the World

The children will get to find out about other people, the place where they live and about all aspects of the environment through three main aspects: People and Communities, The World and Technology.



Expressive Art and Design

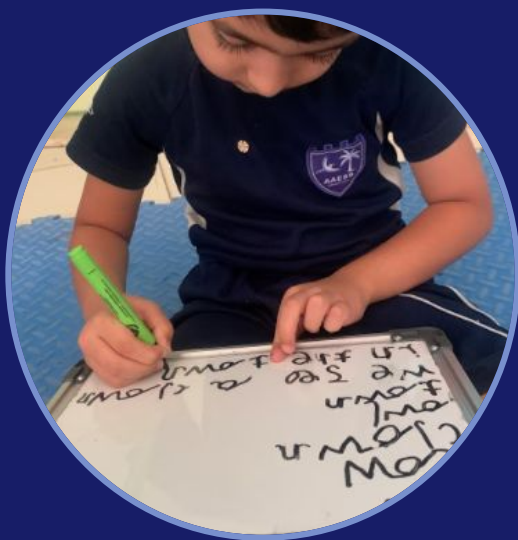
Children will develop their imagination and creativity in a range of ways including: singing songs and making music, dancing, playing with colours, textures and design.

Key Stage 1 Curriculum (Year 1 & Year 2)

Key Stage 1 is an engaging environment that provides plenty of opportunities for the children to develop their skills, knowledge and understanding in meaningful and relevant ways. Lessons are planned with a strong emphasis on investigative and experiential learning where students are able to make connections across different areas of learning and disciplines. Risk taking, creativity, collaboration and independence are also celebrated.



Daily Phonics

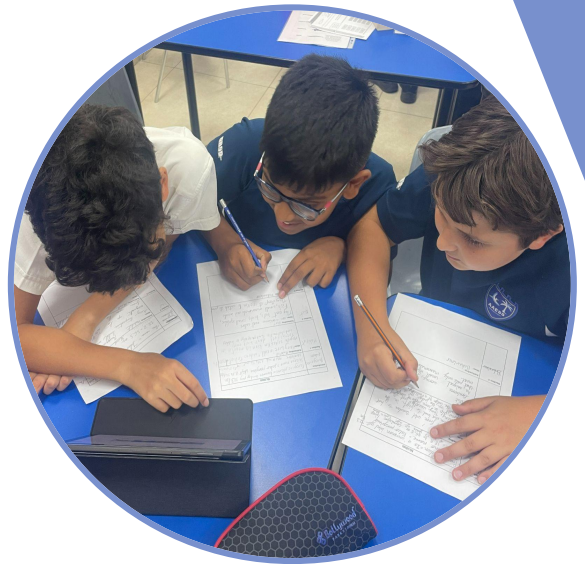


Phonics lessons enable the children to learn the letters and their sounds. Phonics are taught, in the Early Years, in an order that makes it easier to make words. First the children will learn **s, a, t, p, i, n**. Then they learn **m, d, o, c, k, ck, e, u, r, h, b, f, ff, l, ll, ss**. The children will also be taught how to **blend these sounds** together to make words.

Throughout KS1 (Years 1 & 2), the children will continue to develop their phonics knowledge, decoding skills, spelling accuracy and fluency.

Key Stage 2 Curriculum (Year 3, 4, 5 & 6)

The Key Stage 2 curriculum is designed to give all students every opportunity to make full use of their skills, qualities and attributes to prepare them effectively for the secondary school. The main focus is to continue to ensure that the curriculum is adapted to meet every child's needs and celebrates the cultural diversity of the school community. Wherever possible we strive to enrich our curriculum by using intercultural resources and offering a variety of learning opportunities that promote both Emirati and other cultures.



Maths - Mastery



The concept of teaching mathematics to mastery is to ensure that topics are well developed. Students spend time fully exploring a concept before moving on to a different topic. Their new knowledge is then applied in subsequent lessons and pupils have ample opportunity to develop relationships between the topics.

English - Writing

English lessons are carefully planned to be imaginative, progressive and meet the needs of all our students. The use of the Talk for Writing Strategy aims to enthuse children and support their language development through a storytelling approach. It equally provides them with a range of engaging writing opportunities that are suitably tailored to their topic and to match their individual needs.



English - Reading



At AAESS, we aim to promote and develop reading for pleasure across the school as we want our children to see books not only as a vehicle for learning but also as a source of enjoyment!

Research has proven that children who read for pleasure are more likely to be successful and happy throughout their lives and an average read of 20 minutes a day greatly increases vocabulary, fluency and comprehension.

Science

Science teaching focuses on both content and skills. In their lessons, the children are encouraged to be active learners and are provided with opportunities to develop their enquiry skills as well as explore their ideas or try to find answers to their questions.

They increase their science knowledge and understanding by taking part in practical investigations using appropriate equipment.



Integrated Curriculum



Our Integrated Curriculum refers to the foundation subjects of the National Curriculum (Art and Design, Design and Technology, Geography, and History). These subjects are taught through thematic topics which are **enquiry led**. They start with a **‘Hook’** (an initial stimulus or experience designed to help the children connect with the content and skills that will be taught) and end with a final **‘Outcome’** where the children can celebrate or share their achievements with each other, parents or the school community.

Specialist Subjects

AAESS is fully compliant with the UAE Ministry of Education curriculum expectations for the teaching of **Arabic, Islamic and Arabic Social Studies**. Specialist teachers use their expertise to provide high quality learning experiences and outcomes for these subjects.

Enrichment

At AAESS we adopt a holistic approach to education and take pride in being able to offer a range of enrichment opportunities to cater for all our students; taking into account their different abilities and range of interests.



In addition to the wide range of subjects offered in each class, the enrichment activities enable children to make choices about the types of activities they wish to pursue to broaden their experiences and develop their interests.

Enrichment opportunities include: Extra Curricular Activities, Field trips and Workshops.

Inclusion

At AAESS, we aim to provide an atmosphere in which all children can reach their full potential. The school places great emphasis on the early identification of children who may have a learning difficulty or disability which is a barrier to their learning.

When appropriate, members of the Inclusion Team and student's class teacher seek advice and support from a range of external professionals including speech and language therapists, psychologists, physiotherapists and occupational therapists.



The Head of Inclusion and class teachers ensure that parents are kept fully informed about their children's progress through review meetings.

In collaboration, the class teacher, member of the inclusion team and parents agree and create an IEP (Individual Education Plan) designed to best support the student's needs and progress.

Support for students requiring additional support takes many different forms including: specific in-class support, developmental and academic booster groups, small prosocial group sessions, 1:1 support.

Home Learning

As a school we explore every opportunity to encourage a positive approach to learning both at home and school.

The purpose of setting home learning tasks is to enable children to:

- Improve their thinking and memory skills
- Develop positive study skills and habits
- Review and practice what has been covered in class
- Get ready for future learning in classes
- Extend learning by applying skills to new situations
- Help parents become more involved in what their children are learning in school



Student Rewards



On joining the school, all students are assigned to one of our four houses and will collect individual House Points for their house as well as take part in special events or activities within their houses.



Although we strongly encourage teamwork and collaboration through our House Point system, we also recognise the importance of providing opportunities for individual students to be rewarded.

Assessments

Assessment for Learning forms part of the daily life of our school. Data from a number of sources, including children's self and peer assessment, is used to help develop our policy and practice. Assessment data provides useful information, which can then be used to inform the ongoing process of curriculum development and lead to the further raising of educational standards.

Our school assessment is an ongoing process which enables us to celebrate student achievements, identify what has been successfully learnt and provide teachers with valuable information about what still needs to be taught.

From EYFS -Y6 baseline assessments are used at the start of each term to enable teachers to plan effectively to address student needs. In addition to this, summative assessments are scheduled for Y2 - 6 at the end of units of work (half termly) to support teacher judgements as well as monitor and track student progress.



Student Achievement

Each child is valued as a unique individual, and teaching and learning activities are based on the understanding that children develop at different rates.

We recognise parents as key partners in their child's learning journey and therefore parent-teacher meetings are planned each term to ensure there is an open dialogue between home and school. Parents will also receive written academic progress reports at the end of each term highlighting progress, achievements and next steps.

Health and Wellbeing

AAESS is committed to promoting the wellbeing of children, and expects all staff and volunteers to share this commitment.

The Wellbeing committee, in collaboration with the school counselling department, leads the provision of and approach to mental wellbeing at AAESS. The health and safety and general wellbeing of all stakeholders at AAESS is considered a key priority of the school.



Our Clinic



The school has a clinic and full time nurses who deal with any injuries and illnesses which may occur during school hours.

If a student is unwell during the school day, the Clinic Team will assess him/her and call parents to collect the child where necessary.

Please also be reminded children should not attend school if they have sickness, diarrhoea or have fever like symptoms. In the event of any absence from school, and for the safety of everyone, it is important to inform the school about the reason for the absence.

Nutrition

A healthy diet can help concentration and learning. Promoting healthy lifestyles and good eating habits are an essential part of our work as a school.

All food items should be in non-breakable containers and no glass bottles should be used.

There are at least two playtime breaks, in each year group, every day. The timings of these vary depending on the year group but during these breaks the children will have the opportunity to eat their snacks or packed lunch.



To support us in promoting healthy lifestyle choices, please ensure that your child brings the following to school every day:



- **A light, healthy** snack for morning and afternoon snack time
- **A healthy lunch**, e.g. sandwiches, fresh fruit, yogurt. Please encourage your child to eat healthy food therefore no crisps or chocolate and strictly **NO NUTS**
- **A named** water bottle

Communication

We work hard to ensure communication is good, honest, open and based upon mutual respect and understanding. The following official lines of communication used regularly by the school are: announcements on the school website, Year Group WhatsApp messages, emails or phone calls. It is important that you update any changes to your contact details.



Attendance and Punctuality

AAESS places a high value on the regular attendance and punctuality of all students. Every lesson in school has an educational value; therefore, attendance and punctuality support the school's foremost aim of student learning, progress and development.

We ask for your support in trying to achieve attendance as near to 100% as possible. Should your son or daughter be unable to attend classes please ensure the class teacher and primary school attendance officer.



Parental Involvement

The education of our students is a partnership between home and school. Parental involvement is actively encouraged both at home and school.

During the academic year, all parents will be given the opportunity to see and discuss their children's learning. We also provide opportunities for parents to celebrate their child's achievements and successes.



Special Events



Throughout the year there are many special celebrations held at school to enhance and enrich the curriculum. Annual events organised include: National Day and Sports Day.

Dates and timings of all events scheduled will be shared in the Primary Paths and Newsletters.

School Uniform

At AAESS, we believe that wearing a uniform is an identification of pride for our school and helps children develop a sense of belonging and equality. It is therefore important that all students wear the approved uniform.

Parents are asked to ensure all items belonging to each child are labelled with the child's name to prevent the loss of uniform items.



The school will continue to strictly implement the proper wearing of uniforms as it represents the values and environment we endeavour to create.

Admissions Policies and Procedures

To ensure a smooth and personalised admissions experience, our Admissions Team is here to support you at every stage of our 5-step admissions process.

Step 1 - Make an enquiry	Connect with our Admissions Team, who will be able to develop an understanding of your family's needs and guide you through the next steps towards joining the AAESS community.
Step 2 - Visit AAESS	Experience Al Ain English Speaking School firsthand with a personalised campus tour.
Step 3 - Submit your application	Complete our online application form and upload the required documents.
Step 4 - Assessment and Offer	Once your application is submitted, our team will arrange an assessment date. For families applying from overseas, remote assessments can be organised for your convenience.
Step 5 - Secure your place	To confirm your child's place at Al Ain English Speaking School, simply accept the enrolment offer, submit the required documents, and complete the enrolment fee within the given timeframe.


Class Placements

While we understand that some families request specific teachers for their children, we kindly ask that you trust the professional judgment of our teaching teams, who carefully consider each child's needs. All of our teachers are fully qualified, experienced, and committed to creating the best possible learning experience for every student.

Parent-School Agreement

The school works in partnership with parents to enhance their child's learning. To promote positive role modelling by parents, the school will require parental agreement to adhere to the following code of conduct as a minimum requirement:

- a) Respect the vision, mission, and value statements of the school and its learning environment.
- b) Interact with all members of the school community, including students, staff (including security guards, cleaners, etc.), and parents, in a professional and respectful manner, prioritising relationships that benefit the students' best interests.
- c) Recognise that the education and wellbeing of every child during their time in school is a shared responsibility, built upon a positive relationship between the school and the parent. Both parties commit to their respective responsibilities, including ensuring that children engage in home learning, receive sufficient sleep, consume nutritious foods, and participate in physical activity.
- d) Demonstrate exemplary speech and behaviour, setting a positive example for others, and show a readiness to address concerns in a professional manner, whether through verbal or written communication. This includes refraining from raising one's voice or using offensive language.
- e) Refrain from posting culturally inconsiderate or defamatory content about parents, students, or staff of the school on social media as per the *ADEK School Cultural Consideration Policy*.
- f) Seek to clarify a child's version of events with the school's view to bring about a peaceful solution to any disputes.
- g) Correct your child's behaviour, where it could lead to conflict/unsafe conduct or limit the ability of other children to learn.

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- h) Commit to and be respectful of the school's policies, and whilst on school premises behave and dress in a manner that is respectful of UAE national identity and cultural values and its current legislation.
 - i) Ensure excellent daily attendance and punctuality of your child, refrain from scheduling holidays outside official school breaks, monitor your child's academic performance, and adhere to arrival and pick-up timings.
 - j) Monitor your child's work for plagiarism, avoiding unnecessary assistance, and ensuring legitimacy. This also involves refraining from providing false information or excuses for absences.
 - k) Respond to teacher requests to attend parent/teacher meetings as invited and maintain frequent positive communication to benefit your child's growth and steady progress.
 - l) Cooperate with the school's recommendations for additional learning support.

Parents may be asked to leave the school premises or denied access if they disrespect or ignore minimum requirements, at the discretion of the school.

Student Code of Conduct

All students from Year 2 - Year 13 will be required to sign a Student Code of Conduct. This code of conduct will be according to the students' age and stage. The Student Code of Conduct will be shared with parents at the beginning of each academic year, ensuring that all students adhere to it.
