Preschool learning:

Week beginning: Monday 22nd September 2025

This week in Expressive Arts and Design we will explore the magical world of symbolic play, where everyday objects transform into tools for imagination and storytelling. Where an empty box can becomes a car, a banana changes into a phone, a round disk becomes a steering wheel, an empty toilet roll turns into a telescope or a trumpet and much more. We will incorporate natural objects (sticks, stones, leaves, shells) into our play, encouraging each other to see the world around us is full of possibilities. We will create our own sound effects to add to our stories and ideas to build creativity, language and social skills.

This week in Math we will be exploring numbers to five by reciting, counting, and recognising numerals. We will use songs like Five Little Monkeys with finger puppets and props to make counting fun and engaging. We will play silly finger games such as "high 1" up to "high 5" with friends to practice showing numbers. We will also explore five frames, using objects and cubes to count together and match numbers with fingers and numerals

This week in Literacy we will be learning new vocabulary through stories and extended conversations. We will read "Germs Are Not for Sharing" and talk about new words such as germs, sneeze, cough, share, and clean. We will explore how germs spread by using glitter to show how they move from one person to another. We will finish by learning together that "Germs are not for sharing!" and practice keeping our hands clean.

This week Drawing Club will link with our Literacy story "Germs Are Not for Sharing" and we will be using our very own creative styles to draw or paint our very own germs.

This week in Phonics we will begin our first Aspect: Environmental sounds. This is where we will begin learning to develop our listening skills and our awareness of the sounds all around us, inside and outside.

This week in Understanding the World we will begin our first short topic, people who help us, learning about different occupations, with a focus on police officers. We will talk about how police help people, what they wear, and how they keep us safe. We will enjoy a song about police officers and even march along like them. We will also take part in role play at a police station and make our own police badges to explore this important job.

Things to remember: Please send in boxes and empty toilet rolls to support your child's journey through creativity and discovery. We can't wait to see where their imaginations take them.
