Preschool learning:

Week beginning: Monday 6.10. 2025

This week in Phonics we will continue focusing on Phase 1, Aspect 2: instrumental sounds. We will develop our listening and coordination skills by stopping and starting an instrument in response to a signal. We will also explore playing instruments independently to follow and maintain a steady rhythm.

This week in Literacy, we will be introducing the main hook for our exciting Talk for Writing story, which will be revealed after the mid-term break so watch this space! We will begin our personal journey into storytelling by learning to retell a story using actions and key vocabulary. We will continue to build confidence in expressing ideas through words and movement.

This week in Math we will be taking a counting walk around the playground to count different things that we see, such as tricycles and chickens. We will also work in groups to find five leaves or five wood chips as we walk around. We will play with numbered dice to recognise and match numbers on the dice with the correct amount of magnets.

This week in Understanding the World we will be learning all about planting. We'll get to plant our own seeds and discover how to care for them, making sure they have enough water, sunlight, and attention to help them grow.

This week in Expressive Art and Design, we will be exploring different textures (how something feels) and learning how to join them together! We will discover that some textures feel **soft**, like cotton balls, and some feel **hard**, like a bouncy ball. We'll explore **rough** materials such as sandpaper, **bumpy** things like bubble wrap, and **smooth** things like plastic. We will also explore things that are **wet** and **dry**, like a damp sponge and a dry one. During Discovery time, we will touch, feel, and sort lots of different textures. We will make a fun collage using liquid glue and textured materials, while labeling what we explore through touch, and learn lots of new texture words together!
