Preschool learning:

Week beginning: Monday 27. 10. 2025

This week in Expressive Arts and Design, we will be exploring the different techniques we can use to join a variety of materials together using glue, tape, string, and more. As a challenge, we will learn how to use staplers, hole punches, split pins, and pipe cleaners to attach card and paper. We will encourage each other to invent and build our own creations while learning about textures and developing important construction skills.

This week in Understanding the World, we will continue exploring how plants grow by caring for the seeds we planted earlier. We will have the opportunity to observe changes in our plants and talk about what we notice. We will practice naming the different parts of a plant, such as the roots, stem, leaves, and flower, through hands-on activities, songs, and stories to help reinforce our learning.

This week in Math, we will continue to review linking numerals and amounts as we participate in various number activities. The children will use number cards to place the correct number of friends into a circle each time. We will also use building blocks to build homes for animals, using number cards to show us how many animals are allowed to live in a home.

This week in Monster Phonics, we're moving on to Aspect 3, Body Percussion! We will be having lots of fun using different parts of our bodies to make new and exciting sounds from clapping and stamping to tapping and clicking! We will also be listening carefully to discover which body parts make each sound as we continue to build our early listening and phonics skills.

This week in Literacy, we're diving into our first Talk for Writing story, 'The Two Little Hamsters and the Big Bad Cat'! We will be having lots of fun creating our own story map with pictures, simple words, and actions to help us remember and retell the story. As we explore the text together, we'll begin to understand that print can be used in different ways: to tell us a story, give us an instruction, or share information.

In Drawing Club this week, we'll be sketching our very own Big Bad Cat from the story! We will have fun talking about what he looks like, what he can do, and even dreaming up our own ideas about him. Drawing Club is all about using our imagination, growing our vocabulary, and practising those lovely long sentences as we chat and share our ideas. You can help your child build this skill at home by encouraging them to talk about their drawings and asking simple questions like, "Who is in your picture?" or "What's happening here?" You could even take a short video of them explaining their masterpiece and send it to us. We love sharing these special moments in class!

Things to remember: Please can you send into school any unwanted egg cartons, preferably the cardboard type, so that we can continue to plant our seeds. Thank you for your continued support!
